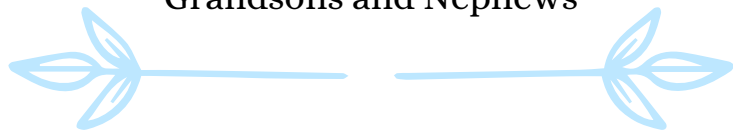

Obituary

Barry put up a brave soldier's fight during a lengthy illness until God said "enough" and called him home from labor to rest.
